OUR TOWN - DAY I

We all have our favorite places to visit in our home town. Whether it be the park, school, shop, restaurant, grandmas house, a sports arena, Museum (of course) and so many more options. This week we are going to think about what each of these places mean to us and write our own cartoon about our town. We have a very special guest who is an art teacher, and has won awards for his humorous portrayal of "Our Town". While we are figuring out our favourite places, and writing a funny cartoon about your best day in our town, Tim Nimigan will be giving you tips on how to turn your every day story into a comic strip.

Today we are going to start by compiling your resources, paper, pens, comic strip template, markers and start to think about your favorite local places that are your favorite to visit.

There is an attachement available online which can be used for your template. If you can print it off to use, great!

If not, you can use it as a plan to draw your own.

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OURTOWN - DAY 2

Do you have a sense of place within our town? Do you like to go to the same place for treats, or to play? How about to buy toys or groceries? To go on an adventure or to learn? Are there places you always dream about going? These places are part of our daily life and help to shape us into the people we are. They also teach us about our community!

What makes these places your favorite? Is it a favorite employee that makes every trip memorable or maybe part of a special tradition? When you are picking out the places you are going to visit, think about what it is that made you choose these places. This is what helps to form your sense of community.

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OURTOWN - DAY 3

Now that you have had determined your sense of place, you can have a conversation with your family about favorite memories. "I love going to the grocery store because every time I go a man who works there gives me a banana". This could either become a very funny comic or you can write it as a story.

comics do not have to be funny. They are described as a series of pictures with a narrative (which means story) that can either be used to tell a story or be funny. Mr. Nimigan, our weekly expert, is great at capturing every day situations in Our Town, and writing text using satire and comedy.

Today, you are going to write your draft of the story you want to tell.
Why each spot you picked is your favorite?
What makes it your favorite? What is your favorite memory in this place?



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OURTOWN - DAY 4

When you write a comic you can be as creative as you like because it is yours! If you decide you would like to tell your story as yourself, then all of the story will be from your point of view. For example: "First thing in the morning I like to go for a walk to the park".

Another option is you could write your story from the point of view of another character. For example, you are a monkey and say "when I go to the park I love to swing around" and "when I go to the grocery store I go bananas". You could also be a carrot, bicycle, fire truck or maybe even a hamster, you can use your imagination! The important part is that who ever your main character is that you are using to represent you is spending their day in the life of you!

The activity today is to write your comic strip story.

Remember you can make it funny or a story.

Each one of your favorite places can go in a square of your comic showing one place. Each square together will make up your day

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OURTOWN - DAY 5

Do you like to draw, paint, sketch or create pictures? Today is your day! Be creative and draw in the way that makes you feel happy! The important thing is to have fun creating. Use your sketches that you made when out for your town tour, to draw your favorite places.



Today we are going to finish our comic strips by drawing your pictures that go along with the story you have written.









1. Start with basic shape











2. Round the corners















3. Add ears

5. Add eyes, nose and mouth












6. Add color. Congratulations, you're a cartoonist!












Write Your Own Comic Strip!
